## Owl at the Moon

Although clouds hid the full moon, visitors to the October 12 program were still wowed by The Raptor Center. Interpretive naturalist Kelly Shanahan introduced a bald eagle, a red-tailed hawk, a falcon and, at right, a great horned owl. With their ragged wing tips, these owls can silently approach their prey, a varied diet of frogs, mice, squirrels, rabbits, waterfowl and even medium-sized mammals, such as skunks and porcupines. They mate in winter and lay eggs by March.



After the Raptor Center presentation, kids made owl masks and went on a nature hike. While they walked, they cupped their hands behind their ears to augment their hearing, much like an owl directs sounds to its ears using the feathers on its facial disc.

## Late Fall and Early Winter Programs

### **Candlelight Hike** **Saturday, February 1, 5:30 p.m.-8 p.m.**

Beginning and ending at the Trail Center, one mile of trail will be lined with luminaries for hiking or snowshoeing. Enjoy a bonfire and s'mores at the halfway point. Volunteers will be needed to set luminaries starting at 3 p.m. You are invited to stay and enjoy the lighted trail.
