






Our vision is to create unforgettable park, trail, and water recreation experiences that inspire people to pass along the love for the outdoors to current and future generations.



Goal setting and project planning

For example: St. Croix State Park (no current friends group)


- 1. Sit down with the manager and staff to discuss top goals for the group and site.
- 2. Review the unit plan for ideas about top goals to prioritize.
- 3. Make sure all projects and activities are aligned with these goals.
- 4. Both parties sign the worksheet and revisit on an annual basis.



Goal setting

What might goals be?

- 1. Greater diversity of experiences
- 2. Get visitors out into the park
- 3. Year round opportunities



Project planning

For example:

Project	Goal	Time	People Involved	Resources Needed	Feasibility
Create more programs that use the trail network	2 (Get visitors out into the park)	1 year	 Park manager or designated staff Naturalist Friends Volunteers 	 Staff time for consultation Volunteer time to create program Volunteers to lead programs Maps and other materials Advertising Other depending on program type 	Highly feasible, need to ensure all Friends volunteers have proper training and paperwork completed. There may be some additional procedural paperwork for "special events," depending on the series of programs.

Note: Staff will need to make sure that any big fundraising or infrastructure projects are vetted at the appropriate DNR level.

It is intended to be a conversation starter and agreement that all parties can sign-off on and revisit each year to make sure priorities are being addressed and strategies are aligned.
