INVEST IN THE FUTURE OF PARKS AND TRAILS

Historically, Minnesota has not invested sufficient resources to maintain park and trail infrastructure in acceptable conditions. Using a combination of bonding, the budget surplus, and the Environmental and Natural Resources Trust Fund (ENRTF), we're advocating for:

\$100 MILLION FOR STATE PARK AND TRAILS:

- \$17.2 million for state park buildings and accessibility improvements.
- \$46.4 million for renovating state park campgrounds and day use areas.
- \$9 million for renovating state park water and wastewater systems.
- \$7.8 million for park and trail bridges.
- \$9.6 million for state trail rehabilitation (HF 491/ SF 1218).
- \$10 million for state park acquisitions.

LOCAL AND REGIONAL GRANT PROGRAMS:

- \$15 million for metro park and trail grants.
- \$4 million for local and regional grants.

ENRTF GRANTS (HF 3377 / SF 3507):

- \$79.6 million to preserve, develop, and maintain Minnesota's natural resources.
- Full package recommended by LCCMR.
- Includes state park acquisition grant to P&TC.

KEEP OHVS OUT OF STATE PARKS

We oppose introducing or expanding the use of off-highway vehicles (OHVs) in state parks:

- State law is clear that OHVs are incompatible with state parks.
- Opinion surveys show state park visitors don't want OHVs in parks.
- OHVs would introduce visitor safety and environmental hazards.
- OHVs already have disproportionate access to public lands.
