BRIEF DESCRIPTION

Funding to improve accessibility and conditions at a trailhead and along seven miles of the Gitchi-Gami State Trail between Gooseberry Falls and Split Rock Lighthouse State Parks.

WHY THIS PROJECT IS IMPORTANT

The Gitchi-Gami State Trail, when complete, will be an 89-mile paved trail providing a high-quality outdoor experience featuring stunning views of Lake Superior and the incredible natural and recreational resources of the North Shore. It will connect communities with public lands, offer transportation alternatives, Safe Routes to School for students, and connect eight state parks, many waysides, museums, historical sites, campgrounds, resorts, and more. The Gitchi-Gami corridor represents much of U.S. Bicycle Route 41 (North Star Route). Continuing to develop the trail will enhance safe transportation and touring opportunities for residents and visitors.

The funds requested here will build critical connections to tourism businesses and town centers, fill gaps to achieve trail continuity, and lay the groundwork for a more unified outdoor recreation system.
